A SENSE OF ACCOMPLISHMENT

The good news throughout this issue of the Connector is the excitement about how much the Lifeline-connect program is working! There is a growing sense of accomplishment—for the staff who are seeing lives transformed and within the individual residents. Three Lifeline residents have entered into Phase 2 of the program—living off-campus and successfully maintaining employment. They have completed the required LC curriculum and 25 weeks of LifeQuest education (basic life skills for handling stress, responsibility and life's challenges). In addition, Travis and Jeff have completed a computer training course at Parkland Community College, sharpening their computer skills and job employability.

But the greatest reward and accomplishment for these men is their growing self-esteem about who they are and what they are able to do. Their emotional and spiritual growth is giving them a new confidence and hope for their future. The combination of Bible studies, LifeQuest education and job training are transforming these men. Thank you for believing in the cause—you too deserve a sense of accomplishment for your continued support of Lifeline-connect.

We asked Tom, Travis and Jeff some questions about their personal growth and accomplishments—and their responses speak volumes about the impact of Lifeline-connect.

TOM MARTIN

What is one thing you have a strong sense of accomplishment about since coming to Lifeline-connect?

"Staying clean as long as I have. It will be 19 months on May 24th. It's the longest I've stayed clean since starting drugs."

In what areas have you grown the most?

"My self-esteem and peace. And my attitude about everything has improved alot—I don't even think the same". (Tom continued next column)

How has Lifeline-connect helped you?

"LC has taken me from 13 years of life on drugs and time in prison, to the person I am today. I've given my life to God completely and am becoming the person I was meant to be."

TRAVIS NAVE

What is one thing you have a strong sense of accomplishment about since coming to Lifeline-connect?

"Having a personal relationship with God... I went to church a lot in my life but lacked a daily intimate relationship."

In what areas have you grown the most?

"Now that I have been delivered from the bondage of addiction, God has given me freedom to express boldness in prayer and worship! This really means a lot to me."

How has Lifeline-connect helped you?

"When I came to lifeline-connect I had already been through three secular rehab programs without success. I had lost my wife, my three children, my home and my purpose due to my drug addiction. Today, after eleven months in LC, God through Lifeline-connect is helping my wife and children and I reconnect. When it looked like divorce was imminent, today we have a new beginning!" His wife Shelly adds, "The change in Travis is nothing short of a miracle from God."

JEFF BRANSON

What is one thing you have a strong sense of accomplishment about since coming to Lifeline-connect?

"In the past, I felt I had no hope and no real future. Now I have great friends, am a part of the greatest church ever, have a good job and I have even begun saving money! I have goals I want to attain and God has given me hope and He has plans for my future."

In what areas have you grown the most?

"In my maturity and attitude. My life was miserable without peace or enjoyment of life. I was depressed, selfish, addicted to drugs, and I guess I really didn't care. I have now been drug free for 20 months and have learned to live life with true joy and peace. That is something the drugs couldn't do."

How has Lifeline-connect helped you?

"After coming to Lifeline-connect, I now have a strong relationship with God. LC has given me tools to help me cope successfully with all the situations in my life, and I am still learning to make wise choices and I'm maturing everyday."

LC RESIDENT: LES COTTON




FINDING RESTORATION THROUGH LIFELINE-CONNECT

"I am 27 years old and I'm from Louisana. Before coming to Lifeline-connect I was addicted to drugs and alcohol for seven years. I came from an Apostolic background and was raised in church until I went to college. During my college years I completely turned my back on God. I partied and did drugs six nights a week. Before I realized it I was addicted to prescription meds, alcohol and the party lifestyle. I completely drifted away from God and lost all my convictions. This lifestyle brought me down to places I never imagined I could be. In seven years I got two DUI's, spent time in jail, and two weeks in ICU due to an overdose; I ruined a nursing career and experienced a broken wedding engagement. At one time I was full of life, but now I was lost in a deep depression with no will to live. I was

in bondage and could feel the chains of sin heavy in my life. I was sick and tired of who I had become. It was time to make a decision. I knew I desperately needed help. While searching for a rehab program I knew it would take more than a secular program. I knew I needed Jesus and the power of the Holy Ghost. My Pastor helped me find Lifeline-connect and I have been in Lifeline-connect for two months now. From day one I began to see changes in my life. God refilled me with the Holy Ghost the second day I was in the program. My life is being restored spiritually and emotionally. I have a fresh start at life, with a strong foundation in Christ, and I am being equipped with the necessary tools to have a successful and fulfilling life in my Savior Jesus Christ."

"Not long ago I stumbled 'round lost and like a bag of trash, my life I had tossed.
