
LIFELINE-CONNECT: OUR 2ND ANNIVERSARY

We're proud of the courage and commitment they exemplify by their voluntary enrollment in LC. They sincerely want to be free from addiction and to live in the abundant life of Jesus Christ.

PHASE-2 HOUSING: OUR VISION

In all aspects of life, there is a time for growth and preparation. It is often through the process of trying, failing and trying again, that a person adapts, learns and grows; the ability to change is crucial. It is a blessing to see that in the hands of God, the trials of each day and our efforts—whether failed or successful—all come together to produce an outcome greater than we could have ever imagined. The Lifeline-connect program is no different. It began many years ago as a burden for men dealing with addiction. And two years ago, Lifeline-connect began. The staff, residents, and the program itself, have all undergone the shifting and molding hand of God, and two years into the program, He is still shaping our vision.

At this point of our growing process, we are ready to push forward and further develop Phase 2 of Lifeline-connect. This transitional phase allows the men to step into more personal responsibilities and start their transition back into society. Our goal is to help them transition into full-time employment, and/or further their education if they desire. Lifeline-connect brothers currently in Phase 2, rent an apartment together, at a facility that is off-campus. However, we have learned through two years of experience, that when LC brothers are ready to return to the work force, it is imperative that they stay "connected". The location of their housing plays a vital role in maintaining this connection with the church and their LC

brothers. In addition, we have learned that serving others while in program has a direct effect on their ability to maintain their progress. Providing subsidized housing on or near campus would be a great blessing during their transition. The closer proximity would allow them to stay connected, and to sow back into the program by serving, leading and being a visible example of solid growth to Phase 1 residents.

Our course of action in reaching our vision is to build Phase 2 housing on or near campus. We have inquired about a piece of land within walking distance from the church and need funds for it to progress. Achieving our vision for Phase 2 will only materialize at a significant price. We are estimating the cost for the land and housing to be between \$200,000–\$225,000. Currently, all funds donated to Lifeline-connect are dispersed to three categories: general operations, administration and tuition. We are asking for you to join with us and support the next phase of developing Lifeline-connect through your prayer and financial support. It is only in working together that we will be able to reach this goal. We welcome any and all contributions toward this endeavor. Thank you, so very much.

"Enrolling in Lifeline-connect was one of the greatest decisions I have ever made. I arrived from Washington D.C. on June 18, 2007. I was 46 years old, and I never believed that I could be free of my addictions. Lifeline-connect took a spiritually blind man by the hand, and helped me see that God loves me. I had always believed that I was not good enough, but Pastor Rogers, Director Randy Brown, and Director of Operations Steven Staten would not let me fall. A big thank you to Sister Rogers for believing in me. Lifeline-connect has helped me understand that the devil will use anything and everything he can to keep a man down. I wanted to stop using, but I could not stay clean. I did not understand what was happening to me. LC is so much more than just a drug rehab program. I know there are people out there who are at the same place that I was—unforgiving and bitter because someone or something hurt you. LC helped me get through my storms and gave me tools to handle whatever might come my way, whether it is good or bad. I am thankful for all the classes that helped me understand. I believe the "Genesis Process" class helped me



see what I could not see in myself. My counselor could see from another viewpoint—thank you, Steve, you really helped me. My brothers who were in the program with me have become some of the best friends that I have ever had. I thought that people who were my drinking buddies, etc. were my friends. Alex, Chad, GP, Tank, Nick, Jeffery, Travis and Joey...I know I can call on you. You know me. These are my friends and this program helped me understand what true friends are all about. During my year in Lifeline-connect I was baptized in Jesus name! I wanted something better, and through this program I received God into my life. I graduated on July 8th, and on July 11th I married Sylvia! If it had not been for Lifeline-connect none of this would have been possible.
