FUTURE HOUSING PLANS ARE MOVING FORWARD

As more and more calls come to us from men needing a "safe place" for recovery, we are moving forward with plans to expand the facilities to accommodate up to 30 men. This will require construction and additional staff. Please pray with us concerning this plan.

In preparation for this expansion it was necessary for the County Zoning Administrator to propose a text amendment to the County Zoning Ordinance. This process has required several meetings: County Board, Zoning Board of Appeals, City Plan Commissions, City Councils, etc. It also has cost us dearly in attorney fees.

The good news is that all of the votes have been unanimously in favor of the amendment. When finally passed, the amended zoning ordinance would make a way for us to request a Special Use Permit to continue the expansion plan.

We appreciate all the funds already donated to this expansion plan. So far, \$19,000 has been given for this cause. We are moving forward...believing the Lord will make a way for this to happen. Thank You for your support.
